



## **Morgan's Wonderland Camp Sponsor-A-Horse Sponsorship Agreement**

This is a Partnership Agreement ("Agreement"), dated as of \_\_\_\_\_ between Morgan's Wonderland Camp, a Texas nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization, ("Client"), and \_\_\_\_\_ ("Sponsor").

### **BACKGROUND**

- A. Morgan's Wonderland Camp is a tax-exempt charitable organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Its mission is to be a versatile camp where individuals of all ages and abilities can create meaningful connections while engaging in Ultra-Accessible™ experiences and adventures.
- B. In 2022, "Morgan's Wonderland Camp Sponsor-A-Horse" Program was created as a collaborative effort between the local community and Morgan's Wonderland Camp for the purpose of assisting in the funding of the Morgan's Wonderland Camp equine program.
- C. Approved individuals, corporations, businesses, and other community sponsors will be able to choose an available horse from the Morgan's Wonderland Camp herd to sponsor for the period of one (1) year with the opportunity to renew their sponsorship annually.

### **REQUIREMENTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

- B. Each horse has a defined list of needs for care as outlined in Attachment A.
- C. The Morgan's Wonderland Camp Sponsor-A-Horse Sponsor commitment will be 1-year from the date of the signed agreement.
- D. The Sponsor is required to commit a minimum donation of \$5,000 annually in order to be an official Morgan's Wonderland Sponsor-A-Horse Sponsor. Funds will be attributed to Morgan's Wonderland Camp Spur Ranch and will be used toward costs associated with the care of the assigned horse.
- E. The specific use of funds provided by the Sponsor will be at the discretion of the Ranch Manager and Morgan's Wonderland Camp Management Team.
- F. Should your group wish to contribute additional supplies, materials, or donations to Morgan's Wonderland Camp, Morgan's Wonderland Camp will recognize your in-kind and monetary support.

- G. All site visits to visit your assigned horse, Spur Ranch, or the Morgan’s Wonderland Camp property must be arranged and approved by the Ranch Manager or Program Director one (1) week prior to the date you want to schedule based on availability with a maximum of 2 visits per year.
  - a. Site Visits consist of a tour provided by the Ranch Manager or Program Director with a maximum of 1.5 hours per tour.
- H. All participants in your Sponsor group must sign and have on file a current liability waiver for each visit to the camp.

**LIMITATIONS**

- A. Should a horse leave the Morgan’s Wonderland Camp program, the Sponsor will be able to select a new horse for the remainder of the sponsorship agreement based on availability.
- B. Morgan’s Wonderland Sponsor-A-Horse year-long commitments may be continued for additional years with both parties’ approval.
- C. Sponsor will provide at least sixty (60) days written notice to Morgan’s Wonderland should Sponsor choose to terminate the agreement early.
- D. Client reserves the right to terminate this agreement at any time. Should the Client feel that the Sponsor group is no longer a fit for the Sponsor-A-Horse program, the Client may terminate this agreement without notice.

**SPONSOR RECOGNITION**

Sponsor will be identified as a “Morgan’s Wonderland Sponsor-A-Horse Sponsor” during the term specified in this agreement. Client will acknowledge Sponsor in accordance with its customary donor recognition practices in addition to the predetermined recognition unique to this Sponsorship Agreement:

<b>Recognition</b>
On-site signage recognizing the sponsorship with name listed on a sign at Spur Ranch
Social media promotion featuring the sponsorship on Instagram
Recognition on Sponsor-A-Horse website page as a Sponsor.
Plaque and portrait of horse to be delivered within 1 month of sponsorship date
(1) One hour horseback riding experience for 5 individuals to be scheduled with Ranch Manager based on availability

**PUBLICITY BY SPONSOR**

Sponsor may identify itself as a "Morgan's Wonderland Sponsor-A-Horse Sponsor" of Client during the term as provided in this agreement. Except as required by law, Sponsor will not issue any press release, use of Client logo, or other public statement (including on its website) relating to its sponsorship without obtaining Client's prior consent. Client and Sponsor agree to all the terms identified in this Agreement as of the date set out.

**Tiny:** Tiny is a Belgian draft horse born in 2005. Tiny had a long-standing career at the Fort Worth Stockyards before retiring to the MWC herd. He still gets to reminisce about his carriage days offering rides in our completely wheelchair-accessible wagon. Tiny is an oxymoron, to say the least, being not only our largest herd member but the biggest teddy bear. Tiny is enjoying his retirement giving riders the highest view from horseback with the kindest soul to make you feel at peace.



**Vinny:** Vinny is a bay standardbred born in 2000. Vinny had a non-remarkable harness racing stint in which he found himself being used as a buggy horse before ending up at an auction house. Vinny was rescued, rehabilitated, and then entered the therapeutic riding program at MWC. He is also the boss man in the herd but has a soft spot for Berta. Vinny is patient and understanding with all riders allowing them to feel at ease with him.



**Berta:** Berta is a dark bay standardbred born in 1997. Berta had a short harness racing career before she joined an Amish family. She worked for many years as a buggy horse until she ended up going to a rescue where she was retrained. Berta is our oldest herd member but acts as though she isn't a day over 15. She is sweet, hardworking and loves to be with her herd mate Vinny.



**Gypsy:** Gypsy is a 2002 Rocky Mountain horse. She had an amazing trail career before she was surrendered to a rescue due to a change in circumstances. Gypsy had EPM (equine protozoal myeloencephalitis) a disease that affects the central nervous system. She was treated and successfully recovered earning her a spot at MWC due to her amazingly sweet and loving nature. We often call Gypsy our fortune teller, bobbing her head yes or no when asking her questions. (Take her answers as serious as you take the magic 8 ball)



**Della:** Della a roan Quarter horse born in 2005. Della had a short rodeo career when she sustained some knee injuries. She was not given time to properly heal which led to having arthritis. This ended her career as a rodeo star and was sent to auction where a wonderful family rescued her. They soon realized that she was not going to be able to continue her rodeo career and surrendered her to the rescue to ensure that she would never end up in a bad situation again. With her very sweet and willing nature she made a perfect candidate to come

assist young riders at camp. She receives daily care to help with her arthritis and time off as needed.



**Shark:** Shark is a roan standardbred born in 2005. Shark had a harness racing career when he was younger. His career was cut short when he sustained laryngeal hemiplegia, causing him to have decreased airflow. This makes Shark one of a kind causing him to snore on the regular even when awake. Shark has an amazing nature which allows him to excel in our therapeutic program.



**Fetty:** Fetty is a sorrel grade horse born in 2019. Fetty being our youngest member of our herd has had one of the most inspiring stories to tell. He was born with a congenital ocular abnormality, leaving him blind in one eye. This is not the most unique thing about him. He spent his entire life sadly chained up to a porch where he was neglected. Even in spite of his unfortunate upbringing he has maintained a forgiving and loving nature. Once he was



rehabilitated at the rescue, he easily joined the MWC herd to continue to inspire campers with his journey to educate campers in overcoming their past.



**Squash:** Squash is a bay quarter horse born in 2014. Squash got his name as he presented to the rescue with what looked like a twisted neck. X-rays were done and the conclusion was that Squash must have been stepped on as a baby and healed so rapidly that his neck fused with a crooked neck (i.e. crooked neck squash). With the veterinarian approval Squash was cleared for riding and his personality blossomed. He is one of the sweetest, most personable horses that shows that looking different can be bright.



**Corella:** Corella is a black and white tobiano pony born in 2017. Corella had an amazing family that was unable to care for her and wanted to ensure she had a great future. She was surrendered and then headed to MWC to help our campers gain confidence when the bigger horses might be a tad scary. Corella has a sweet and sassy personality like most ponies but is all business when it comes time to take care of campers.



**King:** King is a bay standardbred born in 2006. King had a successful career in harness racing before he ended up a buggy horse. He then retired from his pavement hitting life and came to the rescue where he displayed a large loveable personality that was willing to work hard. He proved his worth working the summer as a fill-in spot, capturing the hearts of the staff and campers. He quickly became a favorite and joined the MWC herd permanently.



**Fonzie:** Fonzie is a black 4-year-old mini standing 31inches. He came to the rescue very underweight and a stallion with some of the craziest hair. Fonzie proved to have a heart of gold and a deep desire to please. Fonzie, with his short stature and pleasant personality, is able to be an ambassador to help individuals who are nervous and scared of the sheer size of our standard size horses.



**Money Man:** Money Man is a bay a 2004 standardbred that lived up to his name winning over 750,000 as a harness racing horse. He sadly should have retired but was not allowed that choice. He ended up at an auction where he was saved and placed with the rescue. He soon proved to be a character missing quite a few front teeth due to being kicked in the face. This leaves his tongue often hanging out giving him a goofy grin. His personality proved to make a perfect candidate to join MWC herd, a perfect retirement home.



**Miss G:** Miss G is a bay 2001 Standardbred that never raced but lived with a family that took very good care of her. She was found at auction with a note from her previous owner stating she had many foals and was an excellent mother. She was sent to auction because the family was unable to care for her anymore. She was rescued and joined the herd with her sweet

maternal nature making a perfect herd addition and a perfect addition for our amazing equine therapist
